



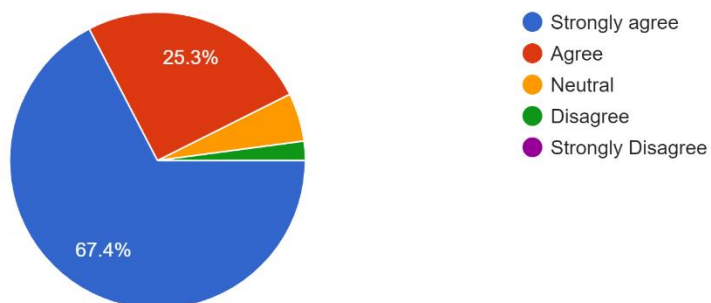
Parent / Carer Survey 2024

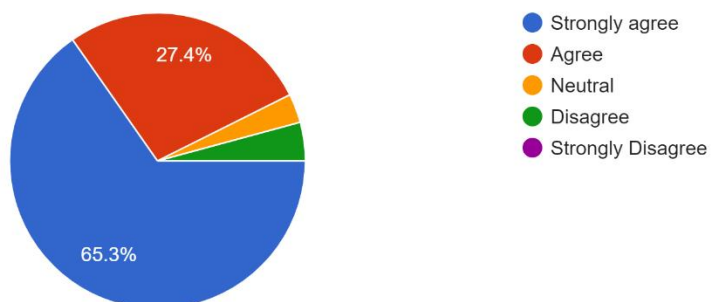
My child is happy at Jubilee.

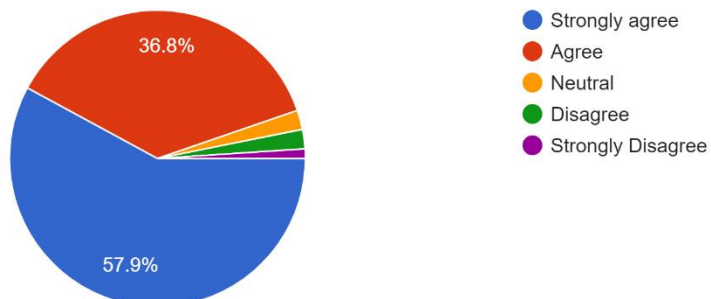
My child feels safe at Jubilee and is well looked after.

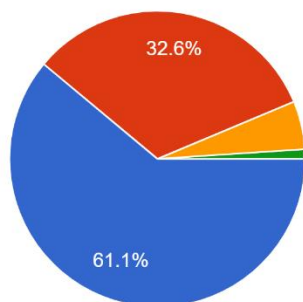
My child makes good progress in their learning at Jubilee.

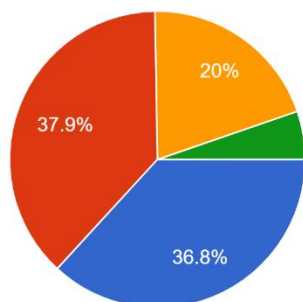
My child is well taught at Jubilee.

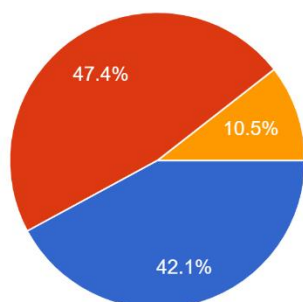
My child receives appropriate homework for their age.

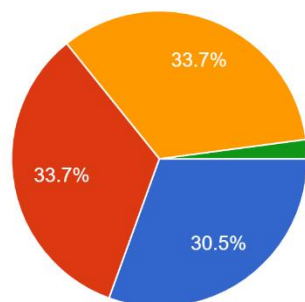
Jubilee ensures pupils are well behaved.

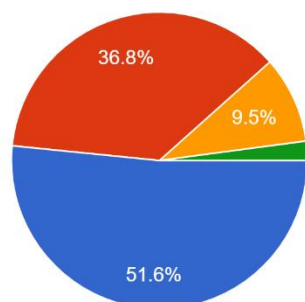
Jubilee deals effectively with bullying.

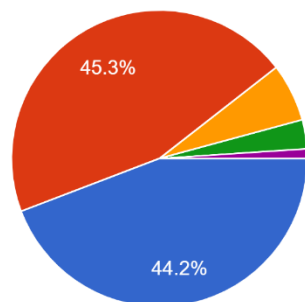
Jubilee is well led and managed.

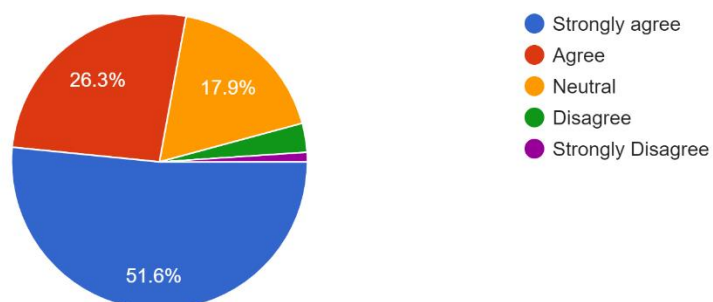
I receive valuable information from the school about my child's progress.

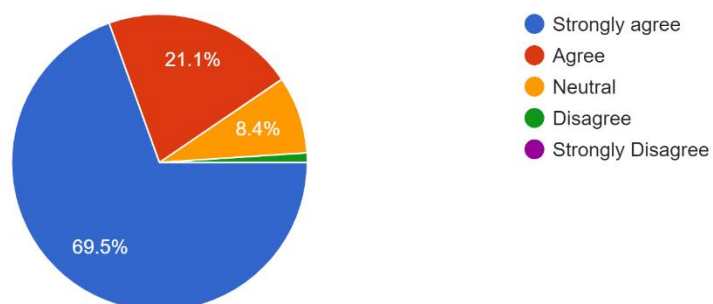
If I raise a concern, Jubilee responds to it well.

Jubilee is an amazing school and I hope they keep up the good work for the years ahead.

The curriculum is often informed by current topics (environmental concerns, life skills, knowing more about the world and other countries) and a modern pedagogy (sharing, discussing, building knowledge based on pupils' responses and interests, and so on), whilst the more universal/traditional aspects (English, maths, etc.) are covered very satisfactorily too.

I am really pleased to how my child is learning in school, she is doing really well. Her teachers are really friendly and supportive. They always welcome me and my daughter with a warm welcome and are always smiling!

I would like to see/hear more information about different teaching pedagogies e.g, how are you encouraging creativity in maths and how is reading comprehension and love of reading supported as well as just phonics.

I would really like 2 PE sessions a week. I do not think 1 a week is adequate.

I understand the need for home learning but it feels like a lot for some of the young kids... cumulatively (phonics videos, phonics books, spelling, suggested online learning etc), they also need time to have unstructured play after such a structured and controlled environment such as the school day

With school clubs I also wish there more options for after school as most (drama, cooking, STEAM, football) seem to run in the morning which is too early. Overall the school is doing a good job, but minor changes to the above would make a massive difference.

I would like to go on record to suggest that the SEND survey isn't completed in the room with the SENCO as that doesn't feel correctly confidential and impartial.

The process of speaking to a member of staff via the admin email can be very slow.

- Exploring additional club opportunities for next academic year
- Updating communication protocols, particularly around the admin email account to ensure all email queries are responded to in a timely manner

- Aiming to provide more information for parents on curriculum & pedagogy
- Developing playtime activities and resources
- Including a 'not applicable' option on this survey in the future
